ABSTRACT

This abstract provides a sample of a LaTeX document which conforms to the formatting guidelines for ICSB2001 abstracts (as opposed to full articles). It is based on (but modified significantly from) the ICSB2001 article style sample file, which in turn was based on a sample created by the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM), and documented more fully in *Author's Guide to Preparing ACM SIG Proceedings Using L^AT_EX₂ ϵ and BibT_EX*. The ACM is not responsible for the ICSB2001 format and sample files; any questions or comments regarding these files should be sent to icsb2001@caltech.edu.

You should use this abstract style if you are submitting a poster or you are an invited speaker to ICSB2001. This abstract style has a two column layout. It is essentially the abstract portion of the full paper layout, with some additional modifications to the way that the additional author and references sections are formatted.

If you are submitting a paper, please use the L^AT_EX style file **icsb2001-article.cls** instead of this file. The latter includes a section for the abstract as part of the style. You do not have to use both the abstract style file and the article style file if you are submitting a paper.

This source file has been written with the intention of being compiled under L^AT_EX₂ ϵ and BibT_EX. As an author of an abstract, you merely need to use the **abstract** environment and the **bibliography** command in your input file. Please avoid the use of other sectioning commands.

The style file takes care of the rest of the formatting. The overall page format features balanced double columns, a specified set of fonts (Arial or Helvetica and Times Roman) in certain specified sizes (for instance, 9 point for body copy), a specified live area (18 × 23.5 cm [7" × 9.25"]) centered on the page, specified size of margins (2.54cm [1"] top and bottom and 1.9cm [.75"] left and right; specified column width (8.45cm [3.33"]) and gutter size (.083cm [.33"]).

The developers have tried to include every imaginable sort of "bells and whistles", such as a subtitle, footnotes on title,

subtitle and authors, etc. You can use whatever symbols, accented characters, or non-English characters you need anywhere in your document; you can find a complete list of what is available in the *L^AT_EX User's Guide*[1].
